The "Batavian Hippocrates," supreme clinician of the eighteenth century, as Sydenham, the "English Hippocrates," was of the seventeenth. In Haller's words, "communis totius Europae praeceptor," he was said to have received without delay a letter from China addressed "To the Illustrius Boerhaave in Europe." Establisher at Leyden of bedside teaching in Northern Europe, he has a special interest for Americans through his influence on the University of Edinburgh, whence his methods were brought to this country by Morgan, Shippen, Rush, Bard, and other American pioneers in medical education.

OTHER ANNIVERSARIES

1538 Vesalius published his "Tabulae Anatomicae Sex."

1638 Birth of Nicolaus Steno or Niels Stensen (Professor of Anatomy at Copenhagen).
Birth of Heinrich Meibom (Described the conjunctival glands in 1666).

Birth of Frederik Ruysch (Professor of Anatomy at Amsterdam). He popularized Swammerdam's innovation in ana-

tomic injections of wax.

1738 Lieberkühn, discoverer of the intestinal glands, invented the reflector microscope.

Frederick Hoffmann, of Halle, investigates fever. ("He had a clear conception that pathology is an aspect of physiology.")

1838 The Medical College of Richmond (Virginia) founded. Johannes Müller published his monumental work on tumors. Ricord established the separate identities of syphilis and gonorrhoea.

Birth of John Shaw Billings. Birth of George Miller Sternberg.

1888 Pasteur Institute founded.

The American Association of Anatomists founded. Roux and Yersin investigated the toxins of diphtheria. Chantemesse and Widal introduce prophylactic vaccines against typhoid fever. Ducrey isolates the bacillus of chancroid. Weil describes infectious jaundice.

Celli demonstrates fly transmission of typhoid fever.

1913 Aschoff and Landau map out the reticulo-endothelial system. Schick introduces susceptibility test for diphtheria. Krönig and Gauss introduce morphine and scopolamine anaesthesia.

Workmen's compensation acts effective in 41 countries.

Coolidge tube introduced.

Potter-Bucky diaphragm introduced.
